

CLERK'S REPORT NO. 2020-031 GRASS CUTTING CONTRACT 2021-2022

To all JPC Officers

By far the highest expenditure for the JPC, excluding grants, is the contractual costs for grass cutting, averaging £15K per annum. Obviously, we can reclaim the VAT which is of the order of £3K but this is still a significant amount, some 8% of the precept.

We have been given very dedicated service by our current contractor, Mr Jon Vale, but we owe it to our residents to get the best possible deal financially, whilst keeping Riverlands and other areas in very good order.

The PayBack team have been steadily growing in their involvement over and above the churchyard project, and it is a combination of their efforts, along with an economically pitched contractor that must now be the aim of the JPC to provide added value.

Local contractors capable of such an undertaking are few, and sadly I have had to turn away aspiring young people who wanted the work broken down into smaller sections.

I have THREE main contenders for the work, Jon Vale, of course will be given the opportunity to tender if he wishes to, and I have selected two others:
