Lock-Down – November 2020

- During the week beginning 2nd November, 2000 leaflets were printed. These were then counted and divided up into road names and volunteers were sought through JPC Facebook page and Henley Matters Face Book page. All roads now have a volunteer and leaflets have been collected and distributed. Some outlying areas that fall under the Parish have had a leaflet sent in the post. These leaflets have the volunteers name and phone number on them and the JPC Community Helpline number on them so residents have enough information going forward into the November lock-down. Councillors will all get a copy of the Volunteers list as soon as it is all collated. This then ensures all Councillors can direct people through the Community Helpline to get to the correct volunteer.
- A list of FAQs for Councillors has also been compiled to help Councillors manning the Community Helpline to help direct residents into the correct service.
- I have also been in discussions with both the chemist and the surgery to look for ways to further improve services during this lock-down. The biggest message is for people to not panic-order their prescriptions and give enough time (around 3-5 days) for collection.

 On Remembrance Sunday, I attended the Remembrance Service in the Jubilee Gardens, which was well planned regarding safety and very moving to be part of such a small congregation. I also laid a wreath on behalf of the JPC. This was live-streamed onto Henley Matters to ensure other residents could take part and was gratefully received by those that chose to watch it.
