

CLERK'S REPORT NO. 2020-045 REVIEW PUBLIC DISPLAY CASES POLICY

At a recent ILCA Clerk's seminar, the subject of public notice boards was debated. Whilst all the Clerks commenting were aware of the need for non-internet users in the community to have access to hard copy, they were also aware that printing out agendas and minutes and other Council notices was not considered green practice, most thought they were probably **ignored most of the time anyway.**

In our case, with two Ordinary, and possibly another three meetings per month, and considering that such documents run to several pages which are impossible to display in cabinets measuring 800×600 mm, it occurred to me to ask you to consider the following:-

That all boxes display the **JPC Calendar of Events** for the year, just circulated to you all, posted just **once** at the beginning of the year and on that notice, the observer is prompted to collect a copy of any **current notice** from Dukes, printed on demand, to take away and read in the comfort of their home. You may think I am trying to reduce my workload, well I am, and it will save the JPC money in doing so. I have spoken with Mark at Dukes; he is OK with it and would only charge for copies **printed on demand** at a mate's rates.

This is not radical, many other authorities are going this way, the bonus is that there would be plenty of room in the boxes for bright colourful posters advertising town events such as the Parish Assembly, Music Festival etc.

With your permission, I will raise this under Clerk's Announcements on Monday next.
