SDC Covid Cases -

Last time we spoke Henley-in-Arden & Claverdon had 28 cases - it is now at 17

Since the start of August we have unfortunately had a 4 deaths in the District where coronavirus is mentioned on the Death certificate.

District News

Local Boundaries Commission

The Local Government Boundary Commission published its recommendations for changes to the Districts warding arrangements last week. Their publication marks the beginning of a consultation period (from 31 August) which will end on 8 November. The relevant documents are available via the following link:

Some headlines from the recommendations:

- the number of councillors should be increased from 36 to 41
- the number of wards should be decreased from 36 to 35
- 29 wards should have a single ward member; 6 wards should have two ward members
- the recommended double ward member wards are (using the recommended ward names and boundaries) - Bidford-on-Avon, Bishop's Itchington, Fenny Compton & Napton, Gayden, Kineton & Lighthorne Heath, Shipston-on-Stour, Stratford West and Studley with Sambourne
- the boundaries of every existing ward should change, with the exceptions of Brailes & Compton and Tanworth-in-Arden which should remain unchanged

It would appear that SDC requests for single member wards has been ignored as has our proposals for boundaries – including that our ward remains the same and continues to include Henley, Beaudesert & Ullenhall.

My personal view - I have always felt that people like local representation and I feel that Henley & Ullenhall have a synergy. I am struggling to see what link Ullenhall has with Spernall, Langley and Mappleborough Green (which some consider as Redditch).

The report makes reference (para 30) to the argument that this review should not take place until the decision of whether or not SDC and WDC are to merge has been taken. The implication seems to

be that if the merger does proceed, these recommendations will have been overtaken by events. If the merger takes place the process will start all over again.

I would however recommend that you take part in this consultation and make your feelings known whatever your thoughts on their proposals.

SDC & WDC Merger to create a South Warwickshire Super District

Public consultation is to begin on proposal to create a South Warwickshire Council Stratford-on-Avon and Warwick District Councils are considering a proposal to merge, creating a new District Council covering the whole of South Warwickshire (the areas currently covered by Stratfordon-Avon and Warwick District Councils).

Why we are doing this? Both Stratford-on-Avon and Warwick councils are facing a very uncertain financial future. Government funding for all councils has reduced in recent years and it is estimated that both councils will have shortfalls increasing to around £4-6m per year by 2025/26. Across the two councils this means that annual savings of around £10m <u>each</u> year are needed over the next five years. This level of annual savings is about one-third of the combined costs of the councils.
