£64,022


Personal giving reached a staggering \mathbf{E} 14,000 Grants and business sponsorship created the remainder.







A little after three o'clock

Monday to Thursday the youngsters burst out of school "free at last", to enjoy the remainder of the day. Around 50 of them come through the door to the Hub to purchase some sweets, enjoy free hot chocolate and toast, play a game of table tennis or pool. Mostly they just enjoy a chill out moment before their journey home. For some this is quite soon. For others who are waiting for the train or for their parents to collect them it can be an hour and a half. For one or two its a time to get consolation from one of our trained youth leaders after a really rough day. For others a chance to share a major concern occurring in their lives and to receive expert advice and support.

More than anything the Hub provides a safe and secure place for youngsters that may otherwise we wandering the streets.



24/7 help line and support.
