Number plate theft

Having had my own number plates stolen whilst I was at a recent Henley in Arden Parish Council meeting the Police have offered this advice.

How to protect your plates

- Use a garage at night if you can Park in busy, well-lit areas if you have to park on the street
- Use safe, well-lit public car parks
- Consider using security screws which can be turned easily using a screwdriver to fit them but cannot be undone using normal tools.
- Consider using theft-resistant number plates which may cost a little more but are designed to resist known attack methods and will break apart if someone tries to remove them by force.
- If your plates are stolen, replace them with a new design so they are different to the lost ones as soon as possible. • Report all suspicious behaviour



Appendix 1 - Funding available

Shared Prosperity Fund

This email is to inform you that for a 6-week period between Monday 5th June and Friday 14th July 2023, Stratford-on-Avon District Council is inviting project submissions to be considered for two alternative funding streams. These two funds are the Shared Prosperity Fund/Rural Shared Prosperity Fund (SPF) and the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) Fund. Each fund has a separate application form and if you wish to submit multiple projects, please submit a separate form for each project.

Two information webinars will be held on Thursday 15th June at 6-7:30 pm and Tuesday 20th June at 8:30-10 am covering both the SPF/REPF and CIL funds. If you would like to attend one of these webinars please register via the Eventbrite registration link https://bit.ly/42db8wt

Shared Prosperity Fund/Rural Shared Prosperity Fund

This is the second year of the three-year Shared Prosperity Fund and the first year of two for the Rural Shared Prosperity Fund. There is one application form for both and you will need to specify which fund you are applying for when completing your application, accompanied by a legal document that also requires completion. Year two's themes for the Shared Prosperity Fund include projects for Community and Places as well as the other major theme of Support for Local Business. Additionally, this year sees the launch of the first year of a two-year programme Rural England Prosperity Fund, with capital grants for small scale intervention in micro and small enterprises in rural areas, investment, and support for digital infrastructure for local community facilities and capital grant funding for rural circular economy projects.

Submitted SPF projects will be assessed, and recommendations presented to the Local Prosperity Advisory Group later in the summer. It is intended that SPF funds will be allocated, and contracts issued during September 2023.

Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) Fund

CIL Project submissions are now invited for consideration for inclusion in the 2022/23 version of the Infrastructure Funding Statement (IFS) and possible CIL funding. The application form is available at https://online1.snapsurveys.com/sdccil.

CIL is intended to fund infrastructure that will support new development within the area, information on the criteria used for assessing CIL project submissions can be found within Chapters 6 and 7 (Tables 16 and 18) of the latest IFS. Submitted CIL projects will be considered for inclusion within the IFS and potential allocation later in 2023.

The District Council adopted its 2021/22 Infrastructure Funding Statement (IFS) in December 2022. The IFS includes a list of the infrastructure projects or types of infrastructure that the authority intends to fund, either wholly or partly, by CIL, this is set out in Table 17 of the current IFS (page 30). Following adoption of the IFS the Council agreed its latest round of CIL allocations based on this list at the Cabinet Meeting held on 6th February 2023.

You may be aware that Parish Councils receive CIL monies directly from developments that take place in their area (15%, or 25% if there is a Neighbourhood Plan in place) to fund localised infrastructure needs.

If your organisation submitted a project that was included on the current IFS List, please can you advise if you wish this project to remain on the list for future potential CIL funding and/or whether there have been any changes to the project information including the funding gap. If this is the case, please submit a fresh form for the project.
