Henley on Arden Specific

Council Tax

The overall increase in Council tax will be around 4.7% (WCC 4.99%, SDC 2.99%, PCC 4.7%, Henley JPC 2.7%) and will mean a resident on a band D in Henley in Arden will see an increase in council tax due from £2171.45 to £2274.27, an increase of £102.82.

Speed monitoring – I am awaiting feedback from each of the teams in the Parishes plus I have booked a further 8 sets of data around the division which brings the number of lines laid to 40. I will aim to analyse Henley's data this week myself and send a separate report in to the JPC.

Fire stations – There is a public consultation on the future of several Fire stations, and it includes Henley Fire Station which the proposals indicate would become a "surge" station i.e., the tender would only be used if other stations cannot respond to an emergency. There is an issue with availability of the teams in some stations, but Henley has a good availability and response rate in comparison to others and it has the added responsibility of covering the motorways and neighbouring local authorities.

If you have an opinion that you want to share, then the consultation process allows this, and it is open until 10th March so please take part in the survey whether you are for keeping Henley Fire Station as it is or support the proposal.

There is one left where you can hear from the Chief Fire Officer and the Portfolio Holder and there will be time to ask questions.

Flooding of homes – potential grants available - A reminder - You will be aware that Warwickshire is one of eight local authorities in the country which received notification from government of potential financial support for residents, business owners and farmers that have been affected by flooding. However, critical to our eligibility for releasing this funding is the need to meet the 50 flooded properties threshold set out in the funding criteria. This requires that at least 50 properties have been confirmed as having been flooded. Can I please ask that if you are aware of any residents in your Parish that have been affected by the flooding that you encourage them to make contact with our Flood Risk Management Team so that they can be confirmed, and potential funding can be released. Budget – There is no doubt that finances remain very tight, but the good news is that both Warwickshire County Council and Stratford District Council are stable and have enough reserves for the next 5 years, but savings must be made, which will be no small task. Officers are confident that they can be achieved and at this point in time there are no plans to withdraw or reduce services in any area, only a desire to get better value for money.

In setting its budget and medium-term financial strategy, the Council will continue to protect valued services for those most in need and provide universal services for all, while investing in key priorities. "This does involve making some savings and difficult choices. But we plan robustly, and this means we are better placed than many councils."

"Our responsible financial management means we can make substantial capital investment such as additional school places to improve the life chances of children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities."

Areas for investment - The Council's Medium Term Financial Strategy sets out several areas for investment over the next five years, this includes:

- a key priority to bring forward business cases for significant capital investment in Special Educational Needs and Disabilities to increase substantially the amount of resource provision available in mainstream schools, and further capital investment from Council funds to provide new school places in the next five years.
- £28.3m to protect our elderly citizens and vulnerable adults to fund additional demand and manage the cost of placements whilst continuing to make progress on our vision of greater integration between health and social care and the adult social care reform agenda.

- £8.3m in our children's social care services, including investment of £4.9m for the increased cost and demand for children's placements and a further £2m support until our own children's homes are fully operational.
- £8.9m invested in home to school transport, particularly to support children and young people with special educational needs, to ensure we continue to provide services in line with our policy whilst being able to respond to the increasing demand and cost of the service.
- £1.2m to meet the increased capacity in our support services to help meet the demand pressures in children and families, education, and adult social care; and
- £0.5 million to support our successful network of Community Pantries to move to a more sustainable longterm delivery model.

Budget reductions - In order to deliver value for money for the taxpayers of Warwickshire and meet the changing needs of its communities, the Council will additionally deliver £16.2 million of budget reductions in 2024/25, increasing to £64 million by 2029, through better procurement, improvements in efficiency, increased income and delivering reductions in demand. This builds on the £15.158 million savings that the council planned to deliver in 2023/24 and £122 million over the last 10 years. Can you suggest a location for electric vehicle charging points in Warwickshire? - Warwickshire residents are being encouraged to suggest possible locations for future electric vehicle charging points in the county. Last year, Warwickshire County Council was allocated £3.3m from the first round of the government's Local Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (LEVI) Capital Fund. Based on current estimates, this funding will allow for the delivery of up to 1,400 charging sockets at both on-street and in car park locations. To deliver on this, residents are being asked to nominate possible locations which would benefit from an electric vehicle charging point. Anyone can make a location suggestion by visiting Request a new electric charging point - Warwickshire County Council or calling 01926 410 410.The Council is particularly interested in hearing about those areas where there is a high demand for electric vehicle charging, such as:

- Residential streets with no off-street parking
- Public car parks
- Rural locations.
