# County Councillor's report for Henley in Arden Joint Parish Council as of 4<sup>th</sup> November 2024

There was a road traffic incident on the 30th September outside the Old Vicarage, close to the Bulls Head in Wootton Wawen, which was shocking, and I am thankful that there were no fatalities, but two children did get injured. The latest information I have received are the following emails email from the Police.

The accident was caused by the driver overtaking on the bend, hitting the kerb causing the vehicle to spin, mounting the pavement and trapped two schoolchildren against the railings of the house

# "I have spoken to the OIC for this matter, and he has informed me the driver has been reported for the offences of careless driving and driving without insurance. They considered the offence of careless driving causing serious injury but the injury on the children were not serious enough for the courts to accept it.

For my part I have been in touch with the Traffic and Safety Officers at County to see what changes could be made to slow the traffic down in Wootton Wawen, especially on this bend. Whilst the A3400 for a large part has good visibility from my perspective pure impatience and stupidity caused this accident. The Children were lucky not have been more seriously injured or killed. The road is 30mph at the entry points into Wotton Wawen and despite the Police having just taken delivery of 3 new speed vans, the area they cover means that enforcement of any speed limits along the A3400 or A4189 is highly unlikely on a regular basis.

**Highways Community Action Fund** - The Highways Community Action Fund is about to be released, or a version of it, allowing each parish up to  $\pounds 25,000$  on a match fund basis to put forward their own scheme for consideration. For example, the parish can put in more than  $\pounds 25,000$  so with a large scheme costing say  $\pounds 75,000$ , WCC will put in  $\pounds 25,000$  and the parish and its partners would put in  $\pounds 50,000$ .

This fund is due to be launched before the end of the year so my advice would be to consider suitable schemes now so that when the scheme is released you are ready to apply.

**Winter Fuel Allowance** – At the October District full council meeting my party (Conservative) put forward a motion asking the government to reverse its decision on WFA with an agreement for a slight amendment to the wording from the Lib Dems. The Lib Dems appeared to agree to this and several of them spoke in favour of the motion but however due to an extremely late amendment from the Green Party which weakened the original motion, the original motion was withdrawn. Not only were we, as Conservatives, angry about the refusal of the Green Party to withdraw their amendment several Lib Dems also called for it to be withdrawn. Sadly, the Leader of the Lib Dems appeared to have instructed other Lib Dems to support the Green Party and the result was recriminations all-round. We conservatives will be highlighting the Winter Fuel allowance issue at the next full council meeting in December . Interestingly a number of Lib Dems apologised to me and other conservative councillors after the meeting in October. They were obviously unhappy about what had happened on a serious motion and the chance to make our feelings known to the Labour Government. It is clear though that the Lib Dems in Stratford feel that pensioners should have insulated their homes better, in other words, it is their own fault. I do not share this view at all. Belatedly, the Leader of the Council has now written a letter to the Prime Minister expressing our concerns,

These include lobbying Government through the 'Right to Food' campaign, enhanced local activity, the development of a more focussed strategic approach, improved understanding through research, promotion of community food production, harnessing the South Warwickshire Local Plan, Licensing Policy and Climate Change Panel to further efforts, enhancing the approach to distribution of surpluses and the improvement of opportunities for children and young people in relation to nutrition and food insecurity/injustice.





# Warwickshire Mid-Year 2023 Population Estimates

This briefing note provides insights for Warwickshire based on the official population estimates for the UK as at 15 July 2024 produced by the Office of National Statistics. Data is based on the 2021 Census and are updated annually to account for population change during the period from 1st July 2022 to 30th June 2023.

Mid-year population estimates relate to the usually resident population. They account for long-term international migrants (people who change their country of usual residence for a period of 12 months or more) but do not account for short-term migrants (people who come to or leave the country for a period of less than 12 months).

The mid-year population estimates are an important source for a wide number of economic and social statistics. Main users include central and local government and the health sector, where they are used for planning and monitoring service delivery, resource allocation and managing the economy as well as being of interest to the general public.



Key Facts – Warwickshire

- The median age of a Warwickshire resident is 42.5 years a decrease of 0.1 from the previous year
- In 2023 Stratford-on-Avon District had the highest median age (48.3 yrs.) while Warwick District had the lowest (40.0 yrs.)
- Between mid-2022 and mid-2023, the population of Warwickshire increased by 1.7% marginally higher than the previous year (1.4%). This compares to growth of 1.0% in England.
- The highest rates of population increase were in Stratford-on-Avon (2.4%) and Rugby (2.0%) followed by Nuneaton & Bedworth (1.7%), Warwick (1.3%), and North Warwickshire (0.3%).
- The proportion of the population aged 65+ is higher in Warwickshire (20.6%) compared to England (18.7%). Just over 1 in 4 of the population in Stratford-on-Avon is aged 65+.
- Deaths exceeded births overall in Warwickshire, there were 5,750 births between mid-2022 and mid-2023 and 6,487 deaths. Therefore, the contribution of natural change to overall population growth was negative, although there was variation between districts and boroughs.
- The key driver of population change in Warwickshire remains internal migration (moves from within the UK) between mid-2022 and mid-2023; net internal migration was 8,245.
- International migration played a larger part in population growth between mid-2022 and mid-2023 compared to recent years; net international migration was 2,583.




