County Councillor's report for Henley in Arden Parish Council Meeting 20th January 2025

Happy New Year. I hope that 2025 is a good year for everyone

It promises to be an interesting year local authority wise with cost pressures affecting budgeting and possible mergers of twotier authorities such as Stratford District Council and other Warwickshire districts and boroughs with Warwickshire County Council to form a new unitary council.

At a national level, yet another social care review as announced by Wes Streeting MP when we already have enough evidence of what is wrong from previous reviews. This latest review just "kicks the can down the road" and delays any meaningful action being taken. The Government have backtracked on what they said about WASPI (women against state pension inequality), it continues to drag its feet on compensating those affected by the Post Office Horizon scandal and even the unions railed against the government on its withdrawal of the winter fuel payments (which it failed to mention in its manifesto). So, the signs don't look good for any changes to adult social care funding.

Successive cross-party committees and governments have wrestled with the problem of an aging population and how to provide care at an affordable level, affordable to the local authorities , of which many are being pushed to the brink financially and affordable to patients and their families. It will be interesting to see in 2025 how this issue will be dealt with as only additional funding will really resolve it, for now, and the only way Government can provide that is by borrowing more (when it has already borrowed £113bn since last March), raising taxes either directly or indirectly (through revaluation of properties for council tax purposes, pension fund taxes, withdrawing concessionary bus passes, to name but a few). **Cutting costs further is getting difficult without losing the quality of the service that the County currently provide.** The other possibility as I highlight below under County News, is savings by reorganisation of local authorities. **However, could the Parish Councils be next** in line for some attention from national government as many sit on large reserves and some services could get passed down to them as part of the creation of new unitary councils. This will be interesting to watch as the government have not been as open with the electorate as they promised to be.

Turning to some good news December 2024 marks 130 years since the Local Government Act of 1894 gave women the right to stand as a district councillor. 57 per cent of Stratford-on-Avon District Council's Cabinet members are women. And 39 per cent of the District Council's councillors are women. This year also marks 50 years since the creation of Stratford-on-Avon District Council.

At this time of the year, we are looking at budgeting and council tax setting. I will be attending another briefing of the budget committee later this week, where I expect to see what the implications of the central government settlement to Warwickshire county Council will be (and Stratford District Council). As soon as I can, I will send a note to you outlining what this means to the precept and the County. It's pretty certain that County will be asking for the full 2.99% increase plus a further 1.99% for adult social care.

Unfortunately, the 1.99% increase specifically earmarked for ASC will not be enough to offset the increasing costs caused by increased National Insurance costs for care homes, the National minimum wage increases and the increasing demand for ASC services. Over 65% of the council tax that the County receive is spent on ASC, Childrens Social care, SEND and Home to School transport. We are employing what is known as the Statutory Over ride which many other local authorities are using , which allows expenditure this year to be carried forward into next year and classed as that year's expenditure. This effectively means that our accounts for this financial year will look better than they really are. However, the impact on cash is felt this year. We await the verdict of the government on how this UK wide issue will be resolved as eventually the over run on cost will need to be declared in a set of accounts. This can only happen in local and national government; the auditors would never allow any other business to account like this.

Merger of Stratford District Council with Warwickshire County Council – This is a summary of the note I sent to all Chairs and Parish Clerks in December – I thought it might be useful to give you an update on this and to correct any misunderstandings about what is happening (or not happening) as the BBC have reported on this.

It is true that the Labour Government are looking to remove the two-tier system of local government that we have now, and this would mean that district and borough councils in Warwickshire would be merged with a higher authority. This could mean that all services would be transferred to Warwickshire County Council with a target date of 2026 or 2027. Warwickshire County Council is made up of district and borough councils (Stratford on Avon District, Nuneaton & Bedworth borough, North Warwickshire borough, Rugby borough, Warwick district).

It is reasonable to assume that removing a tier of local authorities could make the new unitary more efficient and save money, but the aim is to give more powers that allow decisions to be made quickly and in the interests of that unitary plus a

corresponding settlement rather than imposing decisions from a central government. As the white paper says, we are very centralised and one of the few national governments that rely on centralised decisions and power.

The Leader of Warwickshire County Council applied by 10th January 2025 to the government with its interest in developing and proposing a merger of the 5 districts and boroughs plus the County Council into a new Warwickshire Unitary Council. If it is accepted, then it is also likely that the May 2025 County elections would be delayed by a year (or longer). The elections at that point would be to the newly formed unitary council of Warwickshire. Stratford District Council would cease to exist by 2027 at the latest with all its responsibilities being the transferred quickly to the unitary council well before the 2027 deadline.

Nothing is set in stone yet and there is a great deal of uncertainty, but we should hear within the next 3 weeks whether we will be in the first wave of newly formed unitaries.
