County Councillor's report for Henley in Arden Joint Parish Council 22nd April 2025

County Council elections – As you will know by now, I am standing down as a County Councillor at the forth coming elections.

It is fair to say that I will miss being a County Councillor but sometimes there comes a time in your life when you realise that you need to re-prioritise what you are doing and that is what has happened with me. I have spent the last 6 years in local politics and will spend another 3 years as a district councillor but whereas district work is a fairly light load, county work is full time if you're doing this properly. So many thanks to you and everyone I have come into contact, it has been an amazing and rewarding (nearly) three years as your County Councillor so good luck for the future.

News is thin at the moment as we are in purdah, the pore election period where effectively we mustn't say or do anything that "ties the hands" of the next Council.

There are three big issues that confront all of us over the next few months from a District & County perspective

1. Merger of Stratford District Council with Warwickshire County Council
2. South Warwickshire Local Plan
3. County Council Elections

Merger of Stratford District Council with Warwickshire County Council – There was a delay in announcing who would be in the first wave of unitaries, but we eventually heard that SDC and Warwickshire were not in the first wave of local authorities to become a unitary authority. It is likely that many more will be selected next year, and, in the meantime, were told to submit our first outline plan by the 21st March 2025 and a detailed plan by November 2025. More below.

South Warwickshire Local Plan (SWLP) Preferred Options Consultation - The Preferred Options eight-week consultation period ran until Friday 7th March 2025 and includes a range of draft policies and draft policy directions. Whilst the consultation has now closed there will be further opportunities later this year or early next year when the shortlist of sites that are being considered is whittled down from the 24 potential Strategic Growth Locations and 12 potential New Settlement locations contained in the consultation

An important issue that evolved followed questioning by me at a briefing for Councillors, namely that the SWLP team and Head of Planning are considering that all developments over 500 dwellings should also have space for the Gypsy & Traveller Community. Whether this is adjacent to or a separate site near to the new development is yet to be decided.

The Preferred Options document identifies 24 potential Strategic Growth Locations and 12 potential New Settlement locations, which are an indication of where SDC considers large-scale strategic growth may be best be located. Overall, the growth locations identified would accommodate well more than South Warwickshire's housing and employment needs, and it is not expected that all these locations will be allocated in the SWLP.

Government white paper on Unitary Councils – Letters have been prepared by both the County and by the districts and boroughs outlining what type of unitary council they would like to see. The County would like a single unitary whilst the District & Boroughs want two unitaries (a north and a south Warwickshire unitary). This is only the initial stage so the Government can understand what progress has been made.

The net savings over 5 years seem to favour the single unitary whilst the two unitary solutions would be more local. However financial resilience, residents' views and the social care are all considered plus the suggested minimum size of 500,00 residents which only a single unitary can offer.

Residents' views will be sought before the fully detailed plans are sent in by November of this year, It could be May or June 2026 before a decision is made by the Government on which option to go with or with an option of their own.

If you applied by the deadline, you will have received your school offer on National Offer Day, 16 April 2025. On this day, The County sent you the name of the school that your child has been offered for September 2025. You do not need to let them know if you plan to accept this offer. Look out for any updates from the school and visit their website for information on term dates, uniform and any transition arrangements. Your offer letter will tell you how you can refuse the offer. If you do not refuse the offer, County's records will show that the offer has been accepted. If your child has not been offered a place at one or more of your higher preferred schools, or any of the schools you applied for, this will be because the school(s) received more applications than there were places available and other children met the admission criteria more closely than your child. However, your child will have been added to the waiting list(s) for those schools. Appeals are heard by independent appeal panels. You can appeal for any higher preference school for which you have been refused a place. The deadline to submit an appeal for a hearing to take place before the end of the summer term is 2 June 2025. Even if you plan to appeal, we advise you to accept the offer you have been made, so that your child has a secured place for September 2025. Council simplifies home to school transport application process - Warwickshire County Council has introduced a new, streamlined process for home to school transport for pupils starting Year 7 in September 2025. - This means that eligible pupils living in Warwickshire will no longer need to complete application forms. Instead, the Home to School Transport Team will automatically assess eligibility and notify families by 28th of April 2025. Further information will be sent out to confirm the type of transport assistance being provided by 18th August 2025. This change is designed to simplify the process, reduce the need for applications, and ensure transport arrangements are confirmed earlier, giving families peace of mind before the new school year begins.

Families who have a change of circumstances, such as moving house, who are new to Warwickshire or have pupils going into Reception, are advised to continue using the current online application system. Please note that these changes apply only to pupils without an Education, Health, and Care Plan (EHCP) moving into Year 7.

Families who do not receive this notification by 28th of April 2025, but believe their child is eligible should complete the online application form by visiting <https://www.warwickshire.gov.uk/transporthelpunder16>.

Please note that applications for Key Stage Transfers will be processed from the 28th of April 2025 through to the 30th of June 2025.

Eligible residents are those that suffered internal property flooding during Storm Henk (2nd to 12th Jan 2024.) -Whilst the Flood Risk Management team have twice written out to the 106 eligible properties that they are aware of, uptake remains lower than hoped. A further letter detailing the closing date will be sent out in the coming days, alongside a post on the WCC social media pages.

The Highways Community Action Fund has now been launched and may be a good option for the Parish. It offers up to £25,000 of funding on a matched fund basis i.e. a 50/50 match. Previous schemes that have been rejected may not be considered for funding. See below for the link to what can be funded.

Warwickshire Highways Community Action Fund (HCAF)

Delivering the changes on your highways that your community wants

The Warwickshire Highways Community Action Fund is a new £1m investment to support and enable local communities to undertake changes and improvements to the highway in their area. The fund empowers local areas to bring forward their ideas and work in collaboration with Warwickshire County Council (WCC) to make them a reality.

This initiative ensures that local voices are heard and that improvements that might not otherwise happen can be delivered. Community engagement and local support are crucial. Applicants must provide evidence of local backing and a financial contribution, proportional to the project scale, to demonstrate commitment.

Not all proposals will be feasible due to technical, safety, or policy considerations. WCC highway and road safety engineers will review all proposals and collaborate with communities and seek to refine them where needed.



What can be supported?

The HCAF is designed to be a flexible fund, supporting only capital investments that enhance highways. It cannot be used for studies or plans. While local areas determine their proposals, the fund is expected to support projects such as:

- **Local highway maintenance:** Resurfacing, pavement improvements, cycle routes, footpaths, etc.
- **Road safety measures:** Speed reduction initiatives, improved signage, school zones, safe routes to school.
- **Environmental enhancements:** Gateway signs, public realm improvements, signage, and way-marking.
- **Climate change adaptation:** Local drainage improvements.

The anticipated maximum grant per area is £25,000, unless for exceptional circumstances.



Who can apply?

Applications are welcome from local communities across Warwickshire. While town or parish councils are expected to lead applications, community groups may also apply if they can demonstrate broad local support. In areas without a parish or town council, WCC will work with recognised community groups to progress applications.




